Leased Churches

Major repairs completed at All Saints Cockthorpe and St Peter's Corpusty

Thanks to substantial grants from HLF in the case of Cockthorpe and the DCMS Roof Repair Fund at Corpusty the Trust undertook the final phases of long-term repair projects at both churches in 2016. Complex repairs to the chancel roof, as well as renewing the nave and porch roofs at Cockthorpe mean that for the first time in several years the church is free of scaffolding and the whole of the interior can be accessed. At Corpusty all the roofs were repaired and now thanks to a group of local NCT supporters the churchyard is being cleared of scrub and nettles. Gravestones have emerged from the undergrowth and wild flowers are much in evidence.

HLF grant for urgent repairs at All Saints, Snetterton

Work is starting on the development stage of a major repair project at Snetterton. Further funding is needed to complete all the urgent work but the HLF grant means the repair of serious cracks in the tower and chancel arch, plus masonry repairs can be done. The church is currently closed.
