


Autumn Newsletter 2022



We certainly have been blessed with some beautiful autumn days recently, with clear blue skies and stunning autumn colour. So there has been plenty of opportunity to get outdoors and see some of our wonderful Norfolk Churches, like Stoke Holy Cross Parish Church pictured here.

Grants Awarded News

The Grants Committee met on 16th November and have awarded £54,400 which has been split between the following thirteen churches.

Beachamwell, St Mary	£5,000	Tivetshall, St Margaret	£ 5,000

These grants cover such items as helping towards roof and masonry repairs and even conservation of decalogue boards. However, many of these grants awarded are to help with one of the most common problems with our county's Medieval churches; damage caused by worn out drains, gullies, and downpipes. If left, additional problems such as damp penetrating the church building could ultimately lead to structural damage, and expensive repair work. At the Grants Committee Meeting held in July, St Andrew's, Blo Norton was offered a grant of £500 towards the repair and refurbishment of two gullies, the end result of which can be seen in the photograph.

*The funds for the repairs at Warham St Mary were from the generous £10,000 legacy left to the Trust by Derek Fullerton to be used for a grant for repairs to a church in North Norfolk.



Beachamwell

In addition to a grant previously awarded for £3,000; also included in the grants above is £5,000 for Beachamwell, St Mary, to assist with repairs that are not covered by insurance. It is now more than nine months since the devasting fire that left St Mary's Beachamwell a shell, of its former self. The fire that started on the morning of February 2nd, soon took hold and within minutes the entire thatched roof was ablaze, you can see from the pictures here just how devasting the fire was.







The Norfolk Churches Trust is pleased to report that the restoration of this Grade 1 listed building has now commenced, with the hope that the building will be weathertight by the summer of 2023. You can read a fuller report on the progress of the works on our website at

Events



46th Norfolk Churches Trust Annual General Meeting

Wednesday 7th September saw the holding of the Trust's Annual General Meeting. Held at the impressive, Grade 1 listed St Mary's, North Tuddenham. In the chair our President, General the Lord Dannatt, welcomed those assembled and began the meeting by thanking everyone involved in making the past year so successful despite the difficulties resulting from Covid He introduced the Chairman and Honorary Treasurer, who gave their reports for the year to 31st March 2022, in what had been another difficult year due to the ongoing restrictions of the aforementioned Covid 19 pandemic. However, the annual Bike Ride, whilst down on the record breaking year of 2020, still provided a good result, the seventh most successful year overall. Necessity meant that most other events within the year took place out of doors, but this diversification provided some very welcome income.

Once the formalities were over, Mike Smith, Fabric Officer of St Mary's presented *A Race Against Time*, an illuminating talk describing how the church tower was saved from collapse. 
There will Carol Services at three of our Leased Churches this December, everyone is welcome, so please do join us to get in the festive spirit.
