A warm welcome to the first newsletter of 2024. Spring has sprung, well when it is not raining, but on those days when we do have a glimpse of blue sky it is great to get outside in the fresh air and visit some of the wonderful churches that our county has to offer.

We have also held our first Grants Meeting for the year and awarded £54,400 which is to be shared by eight churches, for details see below.

# **Grants Awarded**

Funds raised from subscriptions, donations, events, legacies, and our Sponsored Bike Ride enables the Norfolk Churches Trust to award grants to churches throughout the county. These grants are to assist with a trio of repairs to thatched roofs, repairs to windows, guttering, and scaffolding to enable internal repairs.

You can see from the photographs on the previous page just how much help some of our churches need. Once water gets into a building it can have serious consequences. The Trust continues to fund repairs that will hopefully save further, more expensive works in the future.

#### Works in progress

Talking of waterworks, the Trust was pleased to award a grant in March 2022 of £15,000 to Brisley St Bartholomew. This enabled them to complete Phase 1 of a major maintenance project, namely the installation of drainage pipes, a soak away system, plus the removal of a concrete apron around the base of the church, works that you can see in the photograph on the right.

The church has begun fund raising and planning for Phase 2 of the project, this is to replace the south aisle roof and to repair a large part of the north aisle roof. This is likely to be a longer-term project with costs at present estimated at well over £200k.

# Films at Wells Maltings



Due to popular demand, there will be a repeat showing of a special double bill of locally made films celebrating local subjects and themes. The films in question are *Lucy Lavers – Return to Dunkirk* (63') which documents the *Lucy Lavers*, following her restoration by Rescue Wooden Boats, and *Still Life* (37') which tells the story of the life of Victorian benefactor Sir Alfred Jodrell, whose generosity helped restore many North Norfolk Churches, and who gave us the Glandford Shell Museum, pictured here.



#### **Talk by Alexander Christie-Miller**

The Trust is hosting a special talk on Thursday 18th April from 6.30 to 8.00pm, in the Marble Hall of Wolterton, one of the great houses of Norfolk, courtesy of Mr Richard Ellis and his family. This is sure to be a fascinating evening on the turbulent history of Istanbul, seen through the eyes of Alexander Christie-Miller in his book, To the City: Life and Death Along the Ancient Walls of Istanbul. To the City, seamlessly blends two narratives: the story of Turkey's tumultuous recent past told through the lives of those who live around the walls, and the story of Ottoman Sultan Mehmet II's





siege and capture of the city in 1453. After the talk there will be an opportunity for audience questions and a glass of wine. Tickets, priced at £25 are limited, and selling fast so please book early to avoid disappointment.

#### Sponsored Bike Ride, 2023

The first bike ride in 1983 took place in a heatwave, and history certainly repeated itself last September on the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the event. Nevertheless, an intrepid 579 of you took part by bike, e-bike, static bike, tandem, on foot, by car, including an MG1953, some took advantage of their bus pass and did their 'ride' courtesy of public transport. However, you did yours a big thank you for once again making it a such a successful and enjoyable day and raising the fantastic sum of £129,373.28 which has been split between your nominated churches and the Norfolk Churches Trust grant fund. Our youngest participant was 3 and our eldest included a few octogenarians. Many of you take part year on year, for some this was there first time, to all of you we are really grateful for your efforts. Since its inception the Bike Ride has raised more than £4.3 million which is certainly something to be enormously proud of.
